The ability to be able to spend this time as a group is beneficial and whilst I understand it can be inconvenient for some families the ultimate aim is to improve outcomes for your children.

#### **School Review 2019**

Early last term Clarkson Primary School had its inaugural Public School Review. During the review process we identified some areas where we would like to improve as a school and the review team agreed that, as a school we are well on track with all directions we are taking. The review process was very positive and the team was very strong in its praise of the excellent culture that has developed at CPS. Staff have agreed we are not satisfied with mediocrity and have identified several focus areas around stronger analysis of data and collaboration that will strengthen what we already do. The overall review has validated the positive direction that we are taking. The full review will be available on the school website for anyone wishing to read it. Our next school review will be held in 2022.
