
2020 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS

FROG POND

A FROG pond supplied and built by Bunnings Mindarie with the help of our Kindy Classes in ECE4 and ECE5 is our latest addition to the CPS Community Garden. The Kindy students are currently learning about garden creatures and life cycles of plants and insects so this lovely morning in the garden tied in beautifully with their classroom topic.

Everyone involved enjoyed the activity and a huge thanks to Julie, Frank and Mitch from Bunnings Mindarie for making it happen. Students learned the importance of empathy for nature and caring for the environment and as it is said that frogs are the barometers of environmental health, if we do see frogs starting to appear in this space it would say great things for the balance of the local habitat.

Frog Ponds are being built and developed across the country as part of a new initiative involving the Australian Museum. The program is run through an App called FrogID. The idea is to get children and their families involved in helping scientists identify unknown frog species by the sound of their call.



Welcome to term 4!

This term at playgroup we are learning about shapes. Some of our activities will include shape painting, collage gluing shapes and shape stamp painting. We will also be doing art and craft activities in preparation for Christmas.

We will also have activities and experiences that promote physical skills, socialisation skills and language skills.
