INNOVATION PARTNERSHIP SCHOOL 2019

In 2019, Clarkson Primary School participated in the Innovation Partnership Schools initiative which bought together schools and expert external parties to explore innovative practices that increase student engagement, participation and achievement in Digital Technologies.

Our Digital Technology team began the implementation of Seesaw across the school to build staff and student capacity in the use of digital technologies in the classroom. Seesaw is a tool that teachers and students can record and share what's happening in the classroom. It gives students a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use a variety of digital technologies.

In November, we were invited to share our work at the Resources Technology Showcase held at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre. This provided our school with the opportunity to showcase the innovative practices developed throughout our involvement in the Innovation Partnership.



NAIDOC OPEN NIGHT DISPLAY

Throughout the year the students at Clarkson Primary School have been learning about indigenous culture. In particular, during NAIDOC week in July, the students celebrated the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, participating in a range of activities. At the beginning of this term, the students participating in Aboriginal song and dance workshops or an art workshop, run by talented Aboriginal artist, Jade Dolman from J. D. Penangke.

The year's work culminated in a fantastic display showcasing some of the work completed by the students.




