#### **KINDY ENROLMENTS 2020**

Enrolments are now open for Kindy 2020. If you have a child that was born between 1 July 2015 and 30 June 2016 please visit the front office for an application form, (Part A) or download it from our website at:

You will need to provide a copy of your child's birth certificate or passport, visa if applicable, current Medicare immunisation details and proof of residential address such as a utility bill. Closing date for the first round of offers is **Friday 26**<sup>th</sup> **July.** 

Applications may still be made after this date and will be considered on a case by case basis.

Clarkson Primary School is a local intake school. As Kindy is not compulsory there are limited places, so submit your completed forms in if your child is able to attend kindy in 2020! Kindergarten children may be enrolled into one school only.

All students enrolled for Kindy 2020 at Clarkson are eligible to attend our Early Start Program which will commence in Term 3. Please contact the office for further information.




