

Dear Parent/Guardians

Every Child, Every Classroom, Every day – this is the main priority of the Education Department of Western Australia which means it is also Clarkson Primary School's main priority. At CPS all staff are determined to provide educational programs and experiences that give every child the opportunity to **Learn, Inspire and Grow.** 2020 has been a year that none of us will ever forget and further evidence that we should never take anything for granted in life because we can never accurately predict what is coming next. Despite the disruptions to the year all your children have made pleasing progress. Our Year 2 to 6 students are currently undertaking another round of testing in Reading and Maths using a tool called ACER testing. The data from these tests helps us to plan for the coming year and also track your child's progress whilst at CPS.

Staff and Board members at CPS have been reviewing our 2018 – 2020 Business Plan and busily preparing our 2021 – 2023 Plan. All the data collected from our assessment schedules, surveys, teacher judgements and Department Performance tools will form the basis for the direction we take over the next three years.

As a staff we are proud of the progress being made at the school and thank every member of the school community for your support – this is a team effort and we are all in this together so we can do the best we can for your child. **Year 6 Fundraiser** - For those of you who may be unaware, each year our year 6 graduating students celebrate with a series of activities which culminates in a day trip to Rottnest Island. There is usually about 5 events most of which are offsite and this has been happening since about 2011. To ease the cost to parents a series of fundraising events take place over the year but with COVID 19 restrictions it has been difficult this year. Last Saturday we held our first car wash at the school and it was an outstanding success. Many parents and students came down and washed over 70 cars. A lot of fun was had and over \$1,300 dollars was raised. Your P&C, have also contributed up to \$1,000 which when combined has eased the pressure on parents. Add to this the Icy Poles that year 6's are selling (all donated by Year 6 parents) our year 6's have learned the power of teamwork and community participation. Thank you to everyone who was involved. **School Opening Times** - As we have done for most of this year the school gates are not opening until 8.30 each day.

Please remember that students are not supervised prior to 8.30am so should not arrive at school before this time. I know this is not always easy for parents which is why we have access to Out of School Hours (OSH) situated in Junior Primary area of the school. The weather was threatening but as always the kids loved it and also enjoyed the popcorn & juice box provided by the P&C. Having saved drink containers since Term 2, we raised \$134.70 which will go towards the Yr 6 Big Days Out activities!


Well done to Tyler and Brendan for all of your help!
