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

We are aiming to develop a genuine understanding and knowledge of the Aboriginal history and culture – and reflect this in our daily classroom activities.

Our NAIDOC assembly was a great opportunity for our YAC students to showcase their leadership skills and share their culture. Many of our classes performed assembly items and shared everything they have been learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture.

Clarkson students were all very lucky to take home a seedling kindly donated by Bunnings Mindarie. With this year's theme being "Heal Country" this was a perfect little gift.



CLARKSON CHALLENGE CUP - By Georgia Rm 13

On the 5th of August, 12 of our year 6 students went to participate in the Clarkson Challenge. Every year Clarkson Community High School hosts an event, in which a group of schools nominate 12 students to take part in a S.T.E.A.M activity, which stands for: science, technology, engineering, the arts and math. This year's theme was to design an alien species on the planet 'Clarksonia'. Each group used a variety of colours of plasticine to create their make-believe inhabitants.

Clarksonia has a rocky terrain and vast oceans of water. Clarksonia's vegetation is blue and can act as a food source for herbivores. Our entries were obtained in fish bowls with orange kinetic sand as the ground. Our CPS year 6s aliens were:

Team Angelica- Their alien was a female named Angelica that roamed in the seas, her hair was used as a tail as well as her feet. In her bowl she sits with starfish, rainbow fish, octopus and blue sea plants.

Team Clarkson- Their species was an orange, multi-eyed creature that can camouflage with its surroundings. In its bowl it sat with a Venus flytrap, crabs and some blue plants.

DA LADDS- Their alien was a large octopus-like creature with a harpoon attached to its body. This creature uses its harpoon to grab its prey. This creature has been given the name Cheesy.

All our applications persevered to create a unique and colourful species for the challenge. Our year 6's also tried e-sports, the game they played was Tron. Tron is where you essentially ride a motorbike and as you ride, you leave a wall as your track.

The year 6 group found the Clarkson Challenge boisterous and enjoyable.




BOOK WEEK
