

Clarkson PS is a Positive Behaviours School

Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) is a positive school wide approach to behaviour management. It will build on and integrate a range of existing strategies to improve behaviour, learning & safety. It's a proactive approach whereby expected behaviours are explicitly taught, allowing students to make better choices. PBS is an evidence based approach which focuses on early intervention and emphasises self-discipline.

The 7 components of PBS are:

- 1. Leadership
- 2. Defining expected behaviour
- 3. Teaching expected behaviour
- 4. Encouraging expected behaviour
- 5. Engagement strategies
- 6. Responding to unproductive behaviours
- 7. Ongoing monitoring

At Clarkson Primary School we have four expected behaviours which are set out on our behaviour matrix:

- 1. Be respectful
- 2. Be safe
- 3. Be responsible
- 4. Be a learner

These four expected behaviours sit alongside our fully embedded learning dispositions that staff & students identified as key components that make a great learner at Clarkson Primary School. Great learners are:

- 1. Cooperative
- 2. Resilient
- 3. Persistent & never gives up
- 4. Great communicators
- 5. Are willing to take risks with their learning

Our Whole School Positive Student Behaviour Support Plan is currently under review and will be updated ready for implementation from the commencement of 2022. We have and will be focusing on Positive behaviors' throughout term 4 to improve outcomes for your children.


